## AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to study whether the Apostle Islands National Lakeshore should be protected as a wilderness area.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Gaylord Nelson Apos-
- 5 tle Islands Stewardship Act of 2000".

## 1 SEC. 2. GAYLORD NELSON APOSTLE ISLANDS.

2	(a) Declarations.—Congress declares that—
3	(1) the Apostle Islands National Lakeshore is a
4	national and a Wisconsin treasure;
5	(2) the State of Wisconsin is particularly in-
6	debted to former Senator Gaylord Nelson for his
7	leadership in the creation of the Lakeshore;
8	(3) after more than 28 years of enjoyment,
9	some issues critical to maintaining the overall eco-
10	logical, recreational, and cultural vision of the Lake-
11	shore need additional attention;
12	(4) the general management planning process
13	for the Lakeshore has identified a need for a formal
14	wilderness study;
15	(5) all land within the Lakeshore that might be
16	suitable for designation as wilderness are zoned and
17	managed to protect wilderness characteristics pend-
18	ing completion of such a study;
19	(6) several historic lighthouses within the Lake-
20	shore are in danger of structural damage due to se-
21	vere erosion;
22	(7) the Secretary of the Interior has been un-
23	able to take full advantage of cooperative agree-
24	ments with Federal, State, local, and tribal govern-
25	mental agencies, institutions of higher education,
26	and other nonprofit organizations that could assist

- the National Park Service by contributing to the
  management of the Lakeshore;
- 3 (8) because of competing needs in other units 4 of the National Park System, the standard author-5 izing and budgetary process has not resulted in up-6 dated legislative authority and necessary funding for 7 improvements to the Lakeshore; and
- 8 (9) the need for improvements to the Lakeshore 9 and completion of a wilderness study should be ac-10 corded a high priority among National Park Service 11 activities.
- 12 (b) Definitions.—In this section:
- (1) LAKESHORE.—The term "Lakeshore"
   means the Apostle Islands National Lakeshore.
- 15 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 16 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-17 rector of the National Park Service.
- 18 (c) WILDERNESS STUDY.—In fulfillment of the re-
- 19 sponsibilities of the Secretary under the Wilderness Act
- 20 (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.) and of applicable agency policy,
- 21 the Secretary shall evaluate areas of land within the Lake-
- 22 shore for inclusion in the National Wilderness System.
- 23 (d) Apostle Islands Lighthouses.—The Sec-
- 24 retary shall undertake appropriate action (including pro-
- 25 tection of the bluff toe beneath the lighthouses, stabiliza-

- 1 tion of the bank face, and dewatering of the area imme-
- 2 diately shoreward of the bluffs) to protect the lighthouse
- 3 structures at Raspberry Lighthouse and Outer Island
- 4 Lighthouse on the Lakeshore.
- 5 (e) Cooperative Agreements.—Section 6 of Pub-
- 6 lic Law 91–424 (16 U.S.C. 460w–5) is amended—
- 7 (1) by striking "Sec. 6. The lakeshore" and in-
- 8 serting the following:
- 9 "SEC. 6. MANAGEMENT.
- "(a) IN GENERAL.—The lakeshore"; and
- 11 (2) by adding at the end the following:
- 12 "(b) Cooperative Agreements.—The Secretary
- 13 may enter into a cooperative agreement with a Federal,
- 14 State, tribal, or local government agency or a nonprofit
- 15 private entity if the Secretary determines that a coopera-
- 16 tive agreement would be beneficial in carrying out section
- 17 7.".
- 18 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 19 are authorized to be appropriated—
- 20 (1) \$200,000 to carry out subsection (c); and
- 21 (2) \$3,900,000 to carry out subsection (d).
