A BILL

To protect the budget of the Federal courts.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Courts Budget
- 5 Protection Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. BUDGET ESTIMATES.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 605 of title 28, United
- 8 States Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§ 605. Budget estimates
- 10 "(a) Notwithstanding section 1105(b) of title 31, the
- 11 Director, under the supervision of the Judicial Conference
- 12 of the United States, shall submit to Congress before Jan-
- 13 uary 25 of each year annual estimates of the following:
- 14 "(1)(A) The expenditures and appropriations
- 15 necessary for the maintenance and operation of the
- 16 courts and the Administrative Office and the oper-
- 17 ation of the judicial survivors annuity fund and any
- 18 supplemental and deficiency estimates as may be re-
- 19 quired for such purposes according to law.
- 20 "(B) The estimates required by this paragraph
- 21 shall be approved, before presentation to Congress,
- by the Judicial Conference of the United States, ex-
- 23 cept that the estimate with respect to the Court of
- 24 International Trade shall be approved by that court
- 25 and the estimate with respect to the United States

Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit shall be approved by that court.

"(2)(A) The expenditures and appropriations necessary for real property construction activities, including construction and acquisitions and repairs and alterations, related to United States courthouses and other space occupied by entities of the judicial branch.

"(B) For the purpose of preparing estimated expenditures and appropriations under this paragraph, the Administrator of General Services shall, at such times as are required by Congress or the judicial branch to ensure timely development and consideration of courthouse needs and budget requests, prepare and submit directly—

"(i) prospectuses, including cost estimates, for future judicial branch construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration projects to the Director, the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate, the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives, and the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and House of Representatives; and

"(ii) preliminary planning, design and cost
 estimates of future judicial branch construction,
 acquisition, and repair and alteration projects
 to the Director.

"(C) In accordance with estimates prepared under this paragraph, funds may be appropriated to the judicial branch for deposit into the Federal Buildings Fund for the construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration of Federal courthouses. Funds deposited into the Federal Buildings Fund under this subparagraph shall not be available for expenses in connection with any construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration project for which a prospectus, if required by section 7 of the Public Buildings Act of 1959 (40 U.S.C. 606), has not been approved, except that necessary funds may be expended for each project for required expenses in connection with the development of a proposed prospectus.

"(b)(1) The estimates submitted to Congress under subsection (a) shall also be submitted to the President for inclusion in the budget of the United States. In including the estimates in the budget, the President shall make no change or alterations whatsoever, and shall not impose or otherwise recommend, directly or indirectly, implementa-

- 2 of reduction or change to such estimates.
- 3 "(2) For the purpose of preparing a unified Federal
- 4 budget by the President, the Director shall transmit to
- 5 the President—
- 6 "(A) preliminary estimated expenditures and
- 7 proposed appropriations for the judicial branch be-
- 8 fore October 16 of each year; and
- 9 "(B) final estimated expenditures and proposed
- 10 appropriations for the judicial branch before Decem-
- ber 24 of each year, and such final estimates shall
- be identical to the estimates to be submitted to Con-
- 13 gress under subsection (a).
- 14 "(e) The Director shall cause periodic examinations
- 15 of the judicial survivors annuity fund to be made by an
- 16 actuary, who may be an actuary employed by another de-
- 17 partment of the Government temporarily assigned for the
- 18 purpose, and whose findings and recommendations shall
- 19 be transmitted by the Director to the Judicial Con-
- 20 ference.".
- 21 (b) Responsibilities of the Administrator.
- 22 Except for the budget submission process provided in sec-
- 23 tion 605(a)(2) of title 28, United States Code, as added
- 24 by subsection (a) of this section, the responsibilities of the
- 25 Administrator of General Services for—

1 (1) assessing, with the Director of the Adminis-2 trative Office, facility requirements and specifica-3 tions and costs for the judicial branch; and (2) the planning and performance of construc-5 tion and repair and alteration functions for the judi-6 eial branch; shall not be affected by section 605(a) of title 28, United 8 States Code, as added by subsection (a). SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act may be cited as the "Federal Courts Budget 10 Protection Act". SEC. 2. BUDGET ESTIMATES. 13 (a) In General.—Section 605 of title 28, United States Code, is amended to read as follows: 14 15 "§ 605. Budget estimates 16 "(a) The Director, under the supervision of the Judicial Conference of the United States, shall submit to Congress before January 25 of each year annual estimates of 19 the following: 20 "(1)(A) The expenditures and appropriations 21 necessary for the maintenance and operation of the 22 courts and the Administrative Office and the oper-23 ation of the judicial survivors annuity fund and any 24 supplemental and deficiency estimates as may be re-25 quired for such purposes according to law.

- "(B) The estimates required by this paragraph
 shall be approved, before presentation to Congress, by
 the Judicial Conference of the United States, except
 that the estimate with respect to the Court of International Trade shall be approved by that court and
 the estimate with respect to the United States Court
 of Appeals for the Federal Circuit shall be approved
 by that court.
 - "(2)(A) The expenditures and appropriations necessary for real property construction activities, including construction and acquisitions and repairs and alterations, related to United States courthouses and other space occupied by entities of the judicial branch.
 - "(B) Estimated expenditures and appropriations under this paragraph shall be based on prospectuses and other information provided by the Administrator of General Services.
 - "(C) For the purpose of preparing estimated expenditures and appropriations under this paragraph, the Administrator of General Services shall, at such times as are required by Congress or the judicial branch to ensure timely development and consideration of courthouse needs and budget requests, prepare and submit directly—

"(i) prospectuses, including cost estimates, for future judicial branch construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration projects to the Director, the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate, the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives, and the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and House of Rep-resentatives; and

> "(ii) preliminary planning, design and cost estimates of future judicial branch construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration projects to the Director.

"(D) In accordance with estimates prepared under this paragraph, funds may be appropriated to the judicial branch for deposit into the Federal Buildings Fund for the construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration of Federal courthouses. Funds deposited into the Federal Buildings Fund under this subparagraph shall not be available for expenses in connection with any construction, acquisition, and repair and alteration project for which a prospectus, if required by section 7 of the Public Buildings Act of 1959 (40 U.S.C. 606), has not been approved by the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the

16	"(2) For the purpose of preparing a unified Federal
17	budget by the President, the Director shall transmit to the

19	"(A) preliminary estimated expenditures and
20	proposed appropriations for the judicial branch before
21	October 16 of each year; and
22	"(B) final estimated expenditures and proposed
23	appropriations for the judicial branch before Decem-
24	ber 24 of each year, and such final estimates shall be

- identical to the estimates to be submitted to Congress
 under subsection (a).
- 3 "(c) The Director shall cause periodic examinations of
- 4 the judicial survivors annuity fund to be made by an actu-
- 5 ary, who may be an actuary employed by another depart-
- 6 ment of the Government temporarily assigned for the pur-
- 7 pose, and whose findings and recommendations shall be
- 8 transmitted by the Director to the Judicial Conference.".
- 9 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Section 1105(b) of
- 10 title 31, United States Code, is amended by adding at the
- 11 end the following: "Estimated expenditures and proposed

- 14 mitted to the President in accordance with that section.".
