- 4 This Act may be cited as the "St. Simons Island
- 5 Lighthouse Preservation Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. ST. SIMONS ISLAND, GEORGIA, EXCHANGE.
- 7 (a) Termination of Lease.—
- 8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The United States Postal
- 9 Service shall terminate its lease on the property de-
- scribed in paragraph (2).

1	(2) Description of Property.—The property
2	referred to in paragraph (1) shall be the land de-
3	scribed in the document entitled "Lease for Post Of-
4	fice Quarters" entered into on July 3, 1961, between
5	the United States Postal Service and Capital Prop-
6	erties Inc. for the lease of property for use as a post
7	office at St. Simons Island in Brunswick, Georgia.
8	(b) Land Conveyance.—In consideration of termi-
9	nation of the lease under subsection (a), the Administrator
10	of General Services shall convey to the United States Post-
11	al Service Federal property that is of equal value to the
12	property subject to the lease described in subsection
13	(a)(2).
14	(c) TIMING.—The lease termination under subsection
15	(a) and conveyance under subsection (b) shall be com-
