## A BILL

To recognize National Medal of Honor sites in California, Indiana, and South Carolina.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Medal of
- 5 Honor Memorial Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress makes the following findings:
- 8 (1) The Medal of Honor is the highest military
- 9 decoration which the Nation bestows.

1	(2) The Medal of Honor is the only military
2	decoration given in the name of the Congress of the
3	United States, and therefore on behalf of the people
4	of the United States.
5	(3) The Congressional Medal of Honor Society
6	was established by an Act of Congress in 1958, and
7	continues to protect, uphold, and preserve the dig-
8	nity, honor, and name of the Medal of Honor and
9	of the individual recipients of the Medal of Honor.
10	(4) The Congressional Medal of Honor Society
11	is composed solely of recipients of the Medal of
12	Honor.
13	SEC. 3. NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR SITES.
14	(a) Recognition.—The following sites to honor re-
15	cipients of the Medal of Honor are hereby recognized as
16	National Medal of Honor sites:
17	(1) RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA.—The memorial
18	under construction at the Riverside National Ceme-
19	tery in Riverside, California, to be dedicated on No-
20	vember 5, 1999.
21	(2) Indianapolis, indiana.—The memorial at
22	the White River State Park in Indianapolis, Indiana,
23	dedicated on May 28, 1999.
