6 (a) LIMITATION ON LIABILITY.—In support of the
7 habitat conservation plan of Washington County, Utah,
8 for the protection of the desert tortoise and surrounding
9 habitat, the transfer of the land described in subsection
10 (b) from the city of St. George, Utah, to the United States

shall convey no liability on the United States that did not
 already exist with the United States on the date of the
 transfer of the land.

4 (b) DESCRIPTION OF LAND.—The land referred to in
5 subsection (a) is a parcel of approximately 15 acres of
6 land located within the Red Cliffs Desert Reserve in
7 Washington County, Utah, that was formerly used as a
8 landfill by the city of St. George.
