- 3 (2) by adding at the end the following new sen-4 tence: "For purposes of this section, the term 5 'forced labor or/and indentured labor' includes 6 forced or indentured child labor.".

- (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by subsection (a)(1) applies to goods entered, or with-drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the date that is 15 days after the date of enactment of this Act.
- (2) CHILD LABOR.—The amendment made by subsection (a)(2) takes effect on the date of enactment of this Act.
