## A BILL

- To amend chapter 87 of title 28, United States Code, to authorize a judge to whom a case is transferred to retain jurisdiction over certain multidistrict litigation cases for trial.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Multidistrict Jurisdic-
  - 5 tion Act of 1999".
  - 6 SEC. 2. MULTIDISTRICT LITIGATION.
  - 7 Section 1407 of title 28, United States Code, is
  - 8 amended—

- 1 (1) in the third sentence of subsection (a), by 2 inserting "or ordered transferred to the transferee 3 or other district under subsection (i)" after "termi-4 nated"; and
- 5 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-6 section:
- 7 "(i)(1) Subject to paragraph (2), any action trans-
- 8 ferred under this section by the panel may be transferred,
- 9 for trial purposes, by the judge or judges of the transferee
- 10 district to whom the action was assigned to the transferee
- 11 or other district in the interest of justice and for the con-
- 12 venience of the parties and witnesses.
- 13 "(2) Any action transferred for trial purposes under
- 14 paragraph (1) shall be remanded by the panel for the de-
- 15 termination of compensatory damages to the district court
- 16 from which it was transferred, unless the court to which
- 17 the action has been transferred for trial purposes also
- 18 finds, for the convenience of the parties and witnesses and
- 19 in the interests of justice, that the action should be re-
- 20 tained for the determination of compensatory damages.".
- 21 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- The amendments made by this Act shall apply to any
- 23 civil action pending on or brought on or after the date
- 24 of the enactment of this Act.
