or any of its member unit contractors for water from Weber Basin, Utah, under the Act of February 21, 1911 3 (43 U.S.C. 523), for— 4 (1) the impounding, storage, and carriage of 5 nonproject water for domestic, municipal, industrial, and other beneficial purposes, using facilities associ-6 ated with Weber Basin Project, Utah; and 7 (2) the exchange of water among Weber Basin 8 9 Project contractors, for the purposes set forth in paragraph (1), using facilities associated with the 10 11 Weber Basin Project, Utah.
