To establish age limitations for airmen.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. AGE AND OTHER LIMITATIONS.
4	(a) General.—Notwithstanding any other provision
5	of law, beginning on the date that is 30 days after the
6	date of enactment of this Act—
7	(1) section 121.383(c) of title 14, Code of Fed-
8	eral Regulations, shall not apply;
9	(2) no certificate holder may use the services of
10	any person as a pilot on an airplane engaged in op-
11	erations under part 121 of title 14, Code of Federal

- Regulations, if that person is 65 years of age or older; and
- 3 (3) no person may serve as a pilot on an air-
- 4 plane engaged in operations under part 121 of title
- 5 14, Code of Federal Regulations, if that person is 65
- 6 years of age or older.
- 7 (b) Certificate Holder.—For purposes of this
- 8 section, the term "certificate holder" means a holder of
- 9 a certificate to operate as an air carrier or commercial
- 10 operator issued by the Federal Aviation Administration.
