A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Gaming Clarification
 - 5 Act of 1999".
 - 6 SEC. 2. LAND-BASED GAMING CLARIFICATION.
 - 7 The Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (25 U.S.C. 2701
 - 8 et seq.) is amended—

1	(1) in section $11(d)(1)$ —
2	(A) in subparagraph (B), by striking ",
3	and" and inserting a semicolon;
4	(B) in subparagraph (C), by striking the
5	period and inserting "; and; and
6	(C) by adding at the end the following:
7	"(D) when conducted on trust land located in
8	the State of Missouri, conducted in accordance with
9	any geographic limitation placed by the Missouri
10	State Constitution."; and
11	(2) in section 20(b), by adding at the end the
12	following:
13	"(4) When the Missouri State Constitution author-
14	izes the general assembly of the State to permit, only upon
15	the Mississippi River and the Missouri River, lotteries, gift
16	enterprises, and games of chance to be conducted on ex-
17	cursion gambling boats and floating facilities, the Sec-
18	retary shall not—
19	"(A) take land into trust for an Indian tribe in
20	the State for class II or class III gaming of any kind
21	for any purpose; or
22	"(B) approve class II or class III gaming on
23	lands taken into trust in the State as described
24	above ''
