11	title 10), arising or resulting from, or aggravated by,
12	a negligent or wrongful act or omission of another
13	member of the military or naval forces of the United
14	States or the Federal Government; or
15	"(2) the death of a member of the military or
16	naval forces of the United States resulting from an
17	injury described in paragraph (1).".
