3 SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY OF PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS
4 UNDER THE CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD
5 PROGRAM UNDER THE NATIONAL SCHOOL
6 LUNCH ACT.

7 Section 17(a) of the National School Lunch Act (42
8 U.S.C. 1766(a)) is amended in the second sentence by
9 striking "for which it receives compensation from amounts
10 granted to the States under title XX of the Social Security

Act (but only if such organization receives compensation
 under such title for at least 25 percent of its enrolled chil dren or 25 percent of its licensed capacity, whichever is
 less)" and inserting "with at least 25 percent of the chil dren served by such organization who meet the income eli gibility criteria established under section 9(b) for free or
 reduced price meals".
