A BILL

To require the Federal Communications Commission to follow normal rulemaking procedures in establishing additional requirements for noncommercial educational television broadcasters.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Noncommercial Broad-
- 5 casting Freedom Act".

SEC. 2. COMPLIANCE WITH RULEMAKING PROCEDURES RE-

- 2 QUIRED.
- 3 (a) Limitation.—After the date of enactment of this
- 4 Act, the Federal Communications Commission shall not
- 5 establish, expand, or otherwise modify requirements relat-
- 6 ing to the service obligations of noncommercial educational
- 7 television stations except by means of agency rulemaking
- 8 conducted in accordance with chapter 5 of title 5, United
- 9 States Code, or other applicable law.
- 10 (b) Termination of Effect of Additional Guid-
- 11 ANCE.—The additional guidance contained in paragraphs
- 12 43 and 44 of the Commission's memorandum opinion and
- 13 order in WQED Pittsburgh (FCC 99–393), adopted De-
- 14 cember 15, 1999, and released December 29, 1999, shall
- 15 not be effective after the date of enactment of this Act
- 16 except to the extent such guidance is prescribed in accord-
- 17 ance with subsection (a).
