## A BILL

To amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to prohibit the issuance of a certificate for subminimum wages for individuals with impaired vision or blindness.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. EMPLOYEES WITH IMPAIRED VISION OR BLIND-
- 4 NESS.
- 5 Section 14(c) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of
- 6 1938 (29 U.S.C. 214(c)) is amended—
- 7 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (2), (3), (4),
- 8 and (5) as paragraphs (3), (4), (5), and (6), respec-
- 9 tively; and

1	(2) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
2	lowing:
3	"(2) The Secretary shall not issue a certificate under
4	paragraph (1) to authorize the payment of wages under
5	subparagraph (A) of such paragraph to any individual by
6	reason of such individual's impaired vision or blindness.
7	For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'impaired vision
8	or blindness' means—
9	"(A) any limitation in visual acuity or visual
10	field, including blindness; or
11	"(B) blindness as determined by visual acuity
12	which is no better than 20/200 in the better eye with
13	corrected lenses or visual acuity which, if better than
14	20/200, is accompanied by a limit to the field of vi-
15	sion in the better eye to such a degree that its
16	widest diameter subtends an angle of no greater
17	than 20 degrees.".
