Mr. MURKOWSKI introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation

A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to prohibit the use of electronic measurement units (EMUs).

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Motorists Privacy Act
5 of 2000”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON USE OF ELECTRONIC MEASURE-**
7 **MENT UNITS.**

8 Part I of title III of the Communications Act of 1934
9 (47 U.S.C. 301 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
10 the following new section:

1 **“SEC. 338. PROHIBITION ON USE OF ELECTRONIC MEAS-**
2 **UREMENT UNITS.**

3 “(a) PROHIBITION.—No person may install, post, op-
4 erate, or otherwise use an electronic measurement unit
5 (EMU).

6 “(b) ELECTRONIC MEASUREMENT UNIT DEFINED.—
7 In subsection (a), the term ‘electronic measurement unit
8 (EMU)’ means a device that determines the frequency of
9 the radio broadcast being received by a radio receiver lo-
10 cated within a vehicle passing through the operating range
11 of the device.”.
