Mr. Moynihan introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

## A BILL

To prohibit States from imposing a family cap under the program of temporary assistance to needy families.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSITION OF A FAMILY 4 CAP UNDER THE TANF PROGRAM. 5 (a) Prohibition.—Section 408(a) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 608(a)) is amended by adding at 7 the end the following: 8 "(12) BAN ON FAMILY CAP.—A State to which 9 a grant is made under section 403 may not, under

the State program funded under this part, deny as-

- 1 sistance to a family in respect of an individual be-
- 2 cause the individual was born after the family be-
- 3 came eligible for or began receiving assistance under
- 4 the program.".
- 5 (b) Penalty.—Section 409(a) of the Social Security
- 6 Act (42 U.S.C. 609(a)) is amended by adding at the end
- 7 the following:
- 8 "(15) NO TANF FUNDS FOR PROGRAM WITH
- 9 FAMILY CAP.—Notwithstanding any other provision
- of this part, a State that violates section 408(a)(12)
- during a fiscal year shall remit to the Secretary all
- funds paid to the State under this part for the fiscal
- year, and no payment shall be made under this part
- to a State that has in effect a program that would
- be funded under this part but for a law, regulation,
- or policy that is inconsistent with such section.".
