7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 7401(3) of title 38,
8 United States Code, is amended by striking out "who hold

diplomas as diplomates in psychology from an accrediting
 authority approved by the Secretary".

3 (b) CERTAIN OTHER APPOINTMENTS.—Section
4 7405(a) of such title is amended—

5 (1) in paragraph (1)(B), by striking out "Cer6 tified or" and inserting in lieu thereof "Professional
7 psychologists, certified or"; and

8 (2) in paragraph (2)(B), by striking out "Cer9 tified or" and inserting in lieu thereof "Professional
10 psychologists, certified or".

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made bysubsections (a) and (b) shall take effect on the date ofthe enactment of this Act.

(d) APPOINTMENT REQUIREMENT.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary of Veterans
Affairs shall begin to make appointments of professional
psychologists in the Veterans Health Administration
under section 7401(3) of title 38, United States Code (as
amended by subsection (a)), not later than 1 year after
the date of the enactment of this Act.
