To increase the role of the Secretary of Transportation in administering section 901 of the Merchant Marine Act, 1936, and for other purposes.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

  SECTION 1. TRANSPORTATION IN AMERICAN VESSELS OF

  GOVERNMENT PERSONNEL AND CERTAIN

  CARGOES.

  Section 901(b)(2) of the Merchant Marine Act, 1936

  (46 U.S.C. App. 1241(b)(2)), is amended to read as follows:

  "(2)(A) Notwithstanding any other provision of
- 10 law, the Secretary of Transportation shall have the

1	sole responsibility for determining and designating
2	the programs that are subject to the requirements of
3	this subsection. Each department or agency that has
4	responsibility for a program that is designated by
5	the Secretary of Transportation pursuant to the pre-
6	ceding sentence shall, for the purposes of this sub-
7	section, administer such program pursuant to regu-
8	lations promulgated by such Secretary.
9	"(B) The Secretary of Transportation shall—
10	"(i) review the administration of the pro-
11	grams referred to in subparagraph (A);
12	"(ii) resolve any question concerning the
13	administration of those programs with respect
14	to this section;
15	"(iii) provide for penalties and sanctions
16	for violation of this Act; and
17	"(iv) on an annual basis, submit a report
18	to Congress concerning the administration of
19	such programs.".
