- 6 (a) APPLICABILITY OF FINAL RULE.—The final rule
 7 regulating exhaust emissions from new spark-ignition gas8 oline marine engines promulgated by the Administrator of

the Environmental Protection Agency under section 213
 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7547), published at 61
 Fed. Reg. 52088 (October 4, 1996), shall become fully applicable to engines beginning with engines manufactured
 for model year 2001.

6 (b) LABELING.—Not later than 180 days after the 7 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency shall amend the final 8 9 rule referred to in subsection (a) to require a manufac-10 turer of an engine to which the final rule applies to place on the exterior of the engine cowling or on the hull of 11 12 a personal watercraft powered by such an engine a label 13 that indicates the emission level of the engine relative to that of similar engines by identifying the engine as a low 14 15 emission, very low emission, or ultra low emission engine.

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
