## A BILL

To redesignate the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness,  
Minnesota, as the “Hubert H. Humphrey Boundary Waters  
Canoe Area Wilderness”.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. REDESIGNATION OF BOUNDARY WATERS**  
4       **CANOE AREA WILDERNESS, MINNESOTA.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—In recognition of Senator Hubert  
6       H. Humphrey’s commitment to the preservation of Min-  
7       nesota’s natural resources and dedication to ensuring pub-  
8       lic access to those resources through establishment of the  
9       Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness, Minnesota, by  
10      Public Law 95–495 (16 U.S.C. 1132 note; 92 Stat. 1649),

1 the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness shall be  
2 known and designated as the “Hubert H. Humphrey  
3 Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness”.

4 (b) REFERENCES.—Any reference in a law, map, reg-  
5 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the Boundary  
6 Waters Canoe Area Wilderness, Minnesota, shall be  
7 deemed to be a reference to the Hubert H. Humphrey  
8 Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.
