To amend title 13, United States Code, to eliminate the provision that prevents sampling from being used in determining the population for purposes of the apportionment of Representatives in Congress among the several States.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “A Just Apportionment
5 for All States Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. USE OF SAMPLING.**

2 Section 195 of title 13, United States Code, is
3 amended by striking “Except for the determination of
4 population for purposes of apportionment of Representa-
5 tives in Congress among the several States, the” and in-
6 serting “The”.
