- (2) USE OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS.—Amounts made available under paragraph (1) shall be provided to the entity described in subsection (a) only to the extent that the funds are matched, on an 1-to-1 basis, with contributions from non-Federal sources.

21	(8) the Society continues to acquire additional
22	important collections through bequests, exchanges,
23	and other acquisitions:
