To provide for the mandatory suspension of Federal benefits to convicted drug traffickers, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "No Federal Benefits

5 for Drug Traffickers Act of 1999".

6 SEC. 2. SUSPENSION OF FEDERAL BENEFITS.

7 (a) MANDATORY SUSPENSION FOR DRUG TRAFFICK-

8 ERS.—Section 421 of the Controlled Substances Act (21

9 U.S.C. 862) is amended—

10 (1) in subsection (a)(1)—

1	(A) by striking "at the discretion of the
2	court," each place that term appears;
3	(B) in subparagraph (A), by inserting "not
4	less than 1 year and, at the discretion of the
5	court," before "up"; and
6	(C) in subparagraph (B), by inserting "not
7	less than 3 years and, at the discretion of the
8	court," before "up";
9	(2) in subsection (c), by striking "subsections
10	(a) and" and inserting "subsection"; and
11	(3) in subsection (e), by striking "The penalties
12	provided" and inserting "With the exception of bene-
13	fits denied pursuant to subsection $(a)(1)(C)$, the sus-
14	pension of benefits authorized".
15	(b) Suspension for Individuals Convicted of
16	OTHER DRUG OFFENSES.—Section 421(b)(1)(B) of the
17	Controlled Substances Act $(21 \text{ U.S.C. } 862(b)(1)(B))$ is
18	amended—
19	(1) by inserting "not less than 1 year and, at
20	the discretion of the court," before "up"; and
21	(2) by striking "the court." and all that follows
22	before the period at the end of the subparagraph
23	and inserting "the court, and the court may impose

- 1 the requirements described in clauses (ii) and (iii) of
- 2 subparagraph (A)".
