## A BILL

For the relief of Sergeant Phillip Anthony Gibbs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
- 5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 6 1101 et seq.), Sergeant Phillip Anthony Gibbs shall be
- 7 held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the
- 8 United States for permanent residence as of the date of
- 9 the enactment of this Act upon payment of the required
- 10 visa fee.

## 1 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.

- 2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Ser-
- 3 geant Phillip Anthony Gibbs as provided in this Act, the
- 4 Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to re-
- 5 duce by one number during the current fiscal year the
- 6 total number of immigrant visas available to natives of the
- 7 country of the alien's birth under section 203(a) of the
- 8 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)).
