## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Law Enforcement Offi-
3	cers Retirement Equity Act".
4	SEC. 2. CIVIL SERVICE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
5	(a) Definitions.—Section 8331 of title 5, United

5 (f) MANDATORY SEPARATION.—Section 8425(b) of
6 title 5, United States Code, is amended in the second
7 sentence—

8 (1) by inserting ", revenue officer, customs in-9 spector, customs canine enforcement officer, Immi-10 gration and Naturalization inspector," after "A law 11 enforcement officer"; and

12 (2) by striking "that law enforcement officer"13 and inserting "that officer, inspector,".

#### 14 SEC. 4. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.

15 EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTIONS.—Any individual (a) who has served as a revenue officer, customs inspector, 16 17 customs canine enforcement officer, or Immigration and Naturalization inspector before the effective date of this 18 Act, shall have such service credited and annuities deter-19 20 mined in accordance with the amendments made by sec-21 tions 1 and 2 of this Act, if such individual makes pay-22 ment into the Civil Service Retirement and Disability 23 Fund of an amount, determined by the Office of Personnel 24 Management, which would have been deducted and with-25 held from the basic pay of such individual (including interest thereon) under chapters 83 and 84 of title 5, United
 States Code, as if such amendments had been in effect
 during the periods of such service.

(b) AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.—No later than 90 4 5 days after a payment made by an individual under subsection (a), the Department of the Treasury or the De-6 7 partment of Justice (as the case may be) shall make a 8 payment into the Civil Service Retirement and Disability 9 Fund of an amount, determined by the Office of Personnel 10 Management, which would have been contributed as a Government contribution (including interest thereon) 11 12 under chapters 83 and 84 of title 5, United States Code, 13 for the service credited and annuities determined for such individual, as if the amendments made by sections 1 and 14 15 2 of this Act had been in effect during the applicable peri-16 ods of service.

(c) REGULATIONS.—The Office of Personnel Management shall determine the amount of interest to be paid
under this section and may promulgate regulations to
carry out the provisions of this Act.

#### 21 SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The provisions of this Act and amendments made by this Act shall take effect on the date occurring 90 days after the date of enactment of this Act.
