A BILL

To provide that no Federal income tax shall be imposed on amounts received by Holocaust victims or their heirs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NO FEDERAL INCOME TAX ON AMOUNTS RE-
- 4 CEIVED BY HOLOCAUST VICTIMS OR THEIR
- 5 HEIRS.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of the Internal Rev-
- 7 enue Code of 1986, gross income shall not include any
- 8 amount received by an individual (or any heir of the indi-
- 9 vidual)—

1	(1) from the Swiss Humanitarian Fund estab-
2	lished by the Government of Switzerland or from
3	any similar fund established by any foreign country,
4	or
5	(2) as a result of the settlement of the action
6	entitled "In re Holocaust Victims' Asset Litigation",
7	(E.D. NY), C.A. No. 96–4849, or as a result of any
8	similar action.
9	(b) Effective Date.—This section shall apply to
10	any amount received before, on, or after the date of the
11	enactment of this Act.
