A BILL

To provide funding for the National Park System from outer Continental Shelf revenues.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Park Preser-
- 5 vation Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEDICATION OF A PORTION OF OUTER CONTI-
- 7 NENTAL SHELF REVENUES TO THE NA-
- 8 TIONAL PARK SERVICE.
- 9 (a) Definitions.—In this Act:

1	(1) Leased tract.—The term "leased tract"
2	means a tract leased under section 8 of the Outer
3	Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1337) for
4	the purpose of drilling for, developing, and pro-
5	ducing oil and natural gas resources, consisting of a
6	block, a portion of a block, or a combination of
7	blocks or portions of blocks, as specified in the lease
8	and as depicted on an Outer Continental Shelf Offi-
9	cial Protraction Diagram.
10	(2) OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF.—The term
11	"outer Continental Shelf" has the meaning given
12	the term in section 2 of the Outer Continental Shelf
13	Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1331).
14	(3) Outer continental shelf revenues.—
15	(A) IN GENERAL.—The term "outer Conti-
16	nental Shelf revenues" means all amounts re-
17	ceived by the United States from leased tracts,
18	less—
19	(i) such amounts as are credited to
20	States under section 8(g) of the Outer
21	Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C.
22	1337(g); and
23	(ii) such amounts as are needed for
24	adjustments or refunds of overpayments
25	for rents, royalties, or other purposes.

1	(B) Inclusions.—The term "outer Conti-
2	nental Shelf revenues" includes royalties (in-
3	cluding payments for royalty taken in kind and
4	sold), net profit share payments, and related
5	late-payment interest from natural gas and oil
6	leases issued under the Outer Continental Shelf
7	Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1331 et seq.) for a leased
8	tract.
9	(C) Exclusions.—The term "outer Conti-
10	nental Shelf revenues" does not include
11	amounts received by the United States under—
12	(i) any lease issued on or after the
13	date of enactment of this Act;
14	(ii) any lease under which no oil or
15	gas production occurred before January 1
16	1999; or
17	(iii) any lease in an area for which
18	there is in effect a moratorium on leasing
19	or drilling on the outer Continental Shelf
20	(b) SEPARATE ACCOUNT.—Of amount of outer Conti-
21	nental Shelf revenues received by the Secretary of the In-
22	terior during each fiscal year, \$500,000,000 shall be de-
23	posited in a separate account in the Treasury of the
24	United States and shall, without further Act of appropria-

1	tion, be available to the Secretary of the Interior in subse-
2	quent fiscal years until expended.
3	(c) THREATENED PARK RESOURCES.—
4	(1) In general.—The amounts made available
5	under subsection (b) shall be available for expendi-
6	ture in units of the National Park System that have
7	ecosystems, critical habitat, cultural resources, or
8	other core park resources that are threatened or im-
9	paired.
10	(2) IDENTIFIED THREATS.—The amounts made
11	available under subsection (b)—
12	(A) shall be used only to address identified
13	threats and impairments described in para-
14	graph (1), including use for land acquisition,
15	construction, grants to State, local, or munic-
16	ipal governments, or partnerships with other
17	Federal agencies or nonprofit organizations;
18	and
19	(B) shall not be directed to other oper-
20	ational or maintenance needs of units of the
21	National Park System.
22	(3) Allocation.—Of the amounts made avail-
23	able under subsection (b)—
24	(A) 30 percent shall be available for ex-
25	penditure in units of the National Park System

with ecosystems, critical habitat, cultural resources, or other core park resources threatened or impaired by activities occurring inside the unit; and

(B) 70 percent shall be available for expenditure in units of the National Park System with ecosystems, critical habitat, cultural resources, or other core park resources threatened or impaired by activities occurring outside the unit (including \$150,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2000 through 2015 for the Federal share of the Everglades and South Florida ecosystem restoration project under the comprehensive plan developed under section 528 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1996 (110 Stat. 3767)).

17 (d) Conforming Amendment.—Section 9 of the 18 Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1338) is 19 amended by striking "All rentals" and inserting "Except 20 as provided in section 2 of the National Park Preservation 21 Act, all rentals".
