Mr. BUNNING introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to reduce the tax on vaccines to 25 cents per dose.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Vaccinate America’s
5 Children Now Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION IN TAX ON VACCINES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (1) of section 4131(b)
8 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to amount
9 of tax) is amended by striking “75 cents” and inserting
10 “25 cents”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date of the enact-
3 ment of this Act.

4 (c) LIMITATION ON CERTAIN CREDITS OR RE-
5 FUNDS.—For purposes of applying section 4132(b) of the
6 Internal Revenue Code of 1986 with respect to any claim
7 for credit or refund filed before January 1, 2000, the
8 amount of tax taken into account shall not exceed the tax
9 computed under the rate in effect on the day after the
10 date of the enactment of this Act.

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
