3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be eited as the "Terry Peak Land Con-
- 5 veyance Act of 1999".

1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

2	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
3	(1) certain land in the National Forest system
4	located in the Black Hills National Forest in Law-
5	rence County, South Dakota, is permitted to the
6	Terry Peak Ski Area by the Secretary of Agriculture
7	under the National Forest Ski Area Permit Act of
8	1986 (16 U.S.C. 497b);
9	(2) the Forest land comprises only 10 percent
10	of the land at the Ski Area, and the remaining 90
11	percent of land at the Ski Area is owned by the Ski
12	Area operator;
13	(3) the small percentage of Forest land at the
14	Ski Area
15	(A) is encumbered by ski lifts and trails, a
16	base lodge, a parking lot, and other privately-
17	owned improvements;
18	(B) serves little purpose in continued pub-
19	lic ownership; and
20	(C) should be conveyed to the Ski Area to
21	unify land management and eliminate permit-
22	ting and related administrative costs to the
23	United States;
24	(4) the Ski Area is interested in acquiring the
25	land from the United States;

1	(5) the Secretary lacks the administrative au-
2	thority to convey the land in a non-simultaneous
3	land exchange absent specific authorization from
4	Congress;
5	(6) the Forest contains several small inholdings
6	of undeveloped private land with multiple land-
7	owners that—
8	(A) complicate the management of Forest
9	land; and
10	(B) may be acquired by the United States
11	from willing sellers if funds for the acquisition
12	of the land are made available to the Secretary;
13	(7) the proceeds from the Terry Peak convey-
14	ance would provide a modest, but readily available
15	and flexible source of funds that may be used by the
16	Secretary to acquire certain inholdings in the Forest
17	from willing sellers;
18	(8) due to the small and scattered nature of the
19	inholdings of private land in the Forest and the
20	number of potential sellers involved, the Secretary
21	could acquire the inholdings more quickly and effi-
22	ciently by purchasing them directly rather than ac-
23	quiring the inholdings through administrative land
24	exchanges; and
25	(9) it is in the public interest to—

1	(A) convey the Forest land at Terry Peak
2	to the Ski Area at fair market value; and
3	(B) use the proceeds of the conveyance to
4	acquire more desirable land for addition to the
5	Forest for permanent public use and enjoyment.
6	(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are to—
7	(1) authorize and direct the conveyance of cer-
8	tain Forest land at the Ski Area to the Ski Area;

10	(2) to use the proceeds of the conveyance to ac-
11	quire more desirable land for the United States for
12	permanent public use and enjoyment.

10 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall convey the selected land to the Ski Area at fair market value as deter-11 mined by the Secretary under subsection (b). 12

13 (b) APPRAISAL.

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall deter-15 mine the value of the selected land by using nation-16 ally recognized appraisal standards, including, to the 17 extent appropriate—

18 (A) the uniform appraisal standards for 19 Federal land acquisitions;

20 (B) the uniform standards of professional 21 appraisal practice; and

22 (C) other applicable law.

23 (2) Costs.—As a condition of the conveyance 24 under this section, the Ski Area shall pay all costs 25 of the appraisal.

1	(c) Completion.—The conveyance under this sec-
2	tion shall be completed not later than 180 days after the
3	date of enactment of this Act, unless the Secretary and
4	the Ski Area agree to postpone the completion date.
5	(d) OTHER LAW.—Prior to completing the convey-
6	ance under this section, the Secretary shall complete
7	standard pre-disposal analyses and obtain necessary per-
8	mits and elearances pertaining to—
9	(1) threatened and endangered species;
10	(2) cultural and historic resources;
11	(3) wetland and floodplains; and
12	(4) hazardous materials.
13	(e) USE OF PROCEEDS.—All funds received by the
14	Secretary under this Act shall be—
15	(1) considered to be funds received and depos-
16	ited under the Public Law 90–171 (16 U.S.C.
17	484a); and
18	(2) used by the Secretary to acquire replace-
19	ment land from willing sellers for addition to the
20	Forest.
21	(f) Land Acquired.—
22	(1) In GENERAL.—Any land acquired under
23	subsection $(e)(2)$ shall be added to and administered
24	as part of the Forest.
25	(2) Boundary.

1	(A) IN GENERAL.—If any land acquired
2	under subsection $(e)(2)$ lies outside the exterior
3	boundary of the Forest, the Secretary may
4	modify the boundary of the Forest to include
5	the acquired land.
6	(B) NO EFFECT ON OTHER LAW.—Nothing
7	in this section limits the authority of the Sec-
8	retary to adjust the boundaries of the Forest in
9	accordance with section 11 of the Act of March
10	1, 1911 (36 Stat. 963, chapter 186; 16 U.S.C.

12	(g) Valid Existing Rights; Easements.—The
13	conveyance under this section shall be subject to valid
14	rights, easements (including utility easements), rights-of-
15	way, and any other right, title, or interest of record on
16	the selected land existing on the date of the conveyance
17	of the selected land to the Ski Area.

21	SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
22	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
23	(1) Certain National Forest System land located
24	in the Black Hills National Forest in Lawrence

25 County, South Dakota, is currently permitted to the

1	Terry Peak Ski Area by the Secretary of Agriculture
2	pursuant to section 3 of the National Forest Ski Area
3	Permit Act of 1986 (16 U.S.C. 497b).

4 (2) The National Forest System land comprises
5 only 10 percent of the land at the Ski Area, with the
6 remaining 90 percent located on private land owned
7 by the Ski Area operator.

8 (3) As the fractional Forest Service land holding 9 at the Ski Area is also encumbered by ski lifts, ski 10 trails, a base lodge parking lot and other privately 11 owned improvements, it serves little purpose in con-12 tinued public ownership, and can more logically be conveyed to the Ski Area to unify land management 13 14 and eliminate permitting and other administrative 15 costs to the United States.

16 (4) The Ski Area is interested in acquiring the
17 land from the United States, but the Secretary does
18 not have administrative authority to convey such
19 land in a nonsimultaneous land exchange absent spe20 cific authorization from Congress.

(5) The Black Hills National Forest contains
several small inholdings of undeveloped private land
with multiple landowners which complicate National
Forest land management and which can be acquired

1	by the United States from willing sellers if acquisi-
2	tion funds are made available to the Secretary.
3	(6) The proceeds from the Terry Peak conveyance
4	can provide a modest, but readily available and flexi-
5	ble, funding source for the Secretary to acquire cer-
6	tain inholdings in the Black Hills National Forest
7	from willing sellers, and given the small and scattered
8	nature of such inholdings, and number of potential
9	sellers involved, can do so more efficiently and quickly
10	than through administrative land exchanges.
11	(7) It is, therefore, in the public interest to con-
12	vey the National Forest System land at Terry Peak
13	to the Ski Area at fair market value and to utilize
14	the proceeds to acquire more desirable lands for addi-
15	tion to the Black Hills National Forest for permanent
16	public use and enjoyment.
17	(b) PURPOSE — It is the nurnose of this Act to require

the conveyance of certain National Forest System lands at
the Terry Peak Ski Area to the Ski Area and to utilize the
proceeds to acquire more desirable lands for the United
States for permanent public use and enjoyment.

(c) COMPLETION OF CONVEYANCE.—It is the sense of
Congress that the conveyance to the Ski Area required by
this Act be consummated no later than 6 months after the

date of enactment of this Act, unless the Secretary and the
 Ski Area mutually agree to extend the consummation date.
 Prior to conveying the selected land to the Ski Area, the
 Secretary shall complete standard pre-disposal analyses
 and clearances pertaining to threatened and endangered
 species, cultural and historic resources, wetlands and
 floodplains, and hazardous materials.

8 (d) Use of Proceeds by The Secretary.—All 9 monies received by the Secretary pursuant to this Act shall 10 be considered monies received and deposited pursuant to Public Law 90–171 (16 U.S.C. 484a; commonly known as 11 the Sisk Act) and shall be retained and utilized by the Sec-12 retary until fully expended to acquire replacement land 13 from willing sellers for addition to the Black Hills National 14 15 Forest in South Dakota. Any lands so acquired shall be added to and administered as part of the Black Hills Na-16 tional Forest and, if any such land lies outside the exterior 17 boundaries of the Forest, the Secretary may modify the 18 boundary of the Forest to include such land. Nothing in 19 this section shall be construed to limit the authority of the 20 21 Secretary to adjust the boundaries of the Forest pursuant 22 to section 11 of the Act of March 1, 1911 (16 U.S.C. 521; 23 commonly known as the Weeks Act).

24 (e) CONVEYANCE SUBJECT TO VALID EXISTING
25 RIGHTS, EASEMENTS.—The conveyance to the Ski Area re-

quired by this Act shall be subject to valid existing rights
 and to existing easements, rights-of-way, utility lines and
 any other right, title or interest of record on the selected
 land as of the date of transfer of the selected land to the
 Terry Peak Ski Area.
