JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to prohibit retroactive increases in taxes.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled

3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-

4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
9 by the Congress:

"ARTICLE —

2 "SECTION 1. No new Federal tax, and no increase
3 in a Federal tax, shall take effect before the date of enact4 ment of the new tax or increase.

5 "SECTION 2. This article takes effect on the date of6 its ratification.".
