7 "The Chief Justice and the judges of both the Su8 preme Court and the inferior courts shall hold their offices
9 for the term of ten years. They shall be eligible for nomi10 nation and, by and with the advice and consent of the Sen-

- 1 ate, for appointment by the President to additional terms.
- 2 This article shall not apply to any Chief Justice or judge
- 3 who was appointed before it becomes operative.".
