Mr. Domenici, from the Committee on the Budget, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on the Budget.

- 1 Resolved, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
- 2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
- 3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
- 4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
- 5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
- 6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
- 7 the Committee on the Budget is authorized from October
- 8 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October 1,
- 9 2000, through February 28, 2001, in its discretion (1) to
- 10 make expenditures from the contingent fund of the Sen-
- 11 ate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior con-

- 1 sent of the Government department or agency concerned
- 2 and the Committee on Rules and Administration, to use
- 3 on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable basis the services
- 4 of personnel of any such department or agency.
- 5 Sec. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
- 6 period October 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000,
- 7 under this resolution shall not exceed \$3,449,315, of
- 8 which amount (1) not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended
- 9 for the procurement of the services of individual consult-
- 10 ants, or organizations thereof (as authorized by section
- 11 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as
- 12 amended), and (2) not to exceed \$2,000 may be expended
- 13 for the training of the professional staff of such committee
- 14 (under procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legis-
- 15 lative Reorganization Act of 1946).
- 16 (b) For the period October 1, 2000, through Feb-
- 17 ruary 28, 2001, expenses of the committee under this res-
- 18 olution shall not exceed \$1,472,442, of which amount (1)
- 19 not to exceed \$20,000 may be expended for the procure-
- 20 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
- 21 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
- 22 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2)
- 23 not to exceed \$2,000 may be expended for the training
- 24 of the professional staff of such committee (under proce-

- 1 dures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorga-
- 2 nization Act of 1946).
- 3 Sec. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
- 4 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
- 5 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
- 6 date, but not later than February 29, 2000, and February
- 7 28, 2001, respectively.
- 8 Sec. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
- 9 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
- 10 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-
- 11 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
- 12 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-
- 13 nual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
- 14 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
- 15 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
- 16 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
- 17 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
- 18 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
- 19 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
- 20 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
- 21 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
- 22 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
- 23 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
- 24 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.

- 1 Sec. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
- 2 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
- 3 pensation of employees of the committee from October 1,
- 4 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October 1, 2000,
- 5 through February 28, 2001, to be paid from the appro-
- 6 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-

7 tigations".

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
