## IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. Lugar, from the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

## RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry.

- 1 Resolved, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
- 2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
- 3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
- 4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
- 5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
- 6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
- 7 the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry is
- 8 authorized from October 1, 1999, through September 30,
- 9 2000, and October 1, 2000, through February 28, 2001,
- 10 in its discretion (1) to make expenditures from the contin-

- 1 gent fund of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3)
- 2 with the prior consent of the Government department or
- 3 agency concerned and the Committee on Rules and Ad-
- 4 ministration, to use on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable
- 5 basis the services of personnel of any such department or
- 6 agency.
- 7 Sec. 2. (a) In order to comply with the Grams Reso-
- 8 lution, which requires that subcommittee staff positions
- 9 be funded, the expenses of the committee for the period
- 10 October 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000, under this
- 11 resolution shall not exceed \$2,118,150 of which amount
- 12 (1) not to exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the procure-
- 13 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
- 14 tions thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
- 15 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2)
- 16 not to exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the training
- 17 of the professional staff of such committee (under proce-
- 18 dures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorga-
- 19 nization Act of 1946).
- 20 (b) In order to comply with the Grams Resolution,
- 21 which requires that subcommittee staff positions be fund-
- 22 ed, the expenses of the committee under this resolution,
- 23 for the period of October 1, 2000, through February 28,
- 24 2001, shall not exceed \$903,523, of which amount (1) not
- 25 to exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the procurement

- 1 of the services of individual consultants, or organizations
- 2 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
- 3 Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2) not to
- 4 exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the training of the
- 5 professional staff of such committee (under procedures
- 6 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
- 7 tion Act of 1946).
- 8 (c) Should the Committee on Rules and Administra-
- 9 tion determine that the Committee on Agriculture, Nutri-
- 10 tion, and Forestry not comply with the Grams Resolution,
- 11 the expenses of the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition,
- 12 and Forestry under this resolution for the period October
- 13 1, 1999, through September 30, 2000, shall not exceed
- 14 \$1,933,796 of which amount (1) not to exceed \$4,000 may
- 15 be expended for the procurement of the services of indi-
- 16 vidual consultants, or organizations thereof (as authorized
- 17 by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
- 18 1946, as amended), and (2) not to exceed \$4,000 may be
- 19 expended for the training of the professional staff of such
- 20 committee (under procedures specified by section 202(j)
- 21 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).
- 22 (d) Should the Committee on Rules and Administra-
- 23 tion determine that the Committee on Agriculture, Nutri-
- 24 tion, and Forestry not comply with the Grams Resolution,
- 25 the expenses of the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition,

- 1 and Forestry under this resolution for the period of Octo-
- 2 ber 1, 2000, through February 28, 2001, shall not exceed
- 3 \$824,772, of which amount (1) not to exceed \$4,000 may
- 4 be expended for the procurement of the services of indi-
- 5 vidual consultants, or organizations thereof (as authorized
- 6 by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
- 7 1946, as amended), and (2) not to exceed \$4,000 may be
- 8 expended for the training of the professional staff of such
- 9 committee (under procedures specified by section 202(j)
- 10 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).
- 11 Sec. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
- 12 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
- 13 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
- 14 date, but not later than February 29, 2000, and February
- 15 28, 2001, respectively.
- 16 Sec. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
- 17 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
- 18 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-
- 19 mittee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for
- 20 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-
- 21 nual rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications
- 22 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
- 23 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
- 24 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
- 25 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to

- 1 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
- 2 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
- 3 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
- 4 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
- 5 Recording and Photographic Services, or (7) for payment
- 6 of franked and mass mail costs by the Sergeant at Arms
- 7 and Doorkeeper, United States Senate.
- 8 Sec. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
- 9 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
- 10 pensation of employees of the committee from October 1,
- 11 1999, through September 30, 2000, and October 1, 2000,
- 12 through February 28, 2001, to be paid from the Appro-
- 13 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
- 14 tigations."

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
