## **RESOLUTION**

To authorize testimony, document production, and legal representation in United States of America v. George Patrick Calhoon.

Whereas, in the case of United States of America v. George Patrick Calhoon, Cr. No. H–99–111, pending in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas, testimony has been requested from Court Koenning and Patrick McCartney, employees in the office of Senator Phil Gramm;

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(2) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(2), the Senate may direct its counsel to represent employees of the Senate with respect to any subpoena, order, or request for testimony relating to their official responsibilities;

Whereas, by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may, by the judicial or administrative process, be taken from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate; and

Whereas, when it appears that evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may promote the administration of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistently with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 Resolved, That Court Koenning, Patrick McCartney,
- 2 and any other employee of Senator Gramm's office from
- 3 whom testimony may be required, are authorized to testify
- 4 and produce documents in the case of United States of
- 5 America v. George Patrick Calhoon, except concerning
- 6 matters for which a privilege should be asserted.
- 7 Sec. 2. The Senate Legal Counsel is authorized to
- 8 represent Court Koenning, Patrick McCartney, and any
- 9 other employee of Senator Gramm's office in connection
- 10 with the testimony and document production authorized
- 11 in section one of this resolution.
