CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To require the display of the Ten Commandments in the chambers of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

- Whereas the Ten Commandments have had a significant impact on the development of the fundamental legal principles on which Western civilization and the United States are based;
- Whereas the Ten Commandments are a code of moral conduct, observance of which promotes a peaceful and organized society; and
- Whereas the text of the Ten Commandments is currently displayed on several government properties and in several government buildings: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 - 2 concurring),

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This resolution may be cited as the "Ten Command-
- 3 ments Public Display Resolution of 2002".

4 SEC. 2. POSTING OF THE TEN COMMANDMENTS.

- 5 The Architect of the Capitol shall prominently display
- 6 the text of the Ten Commandments in the chambers of
- 7 the House of Representatives and the Senate. The form,
- 8 size, manner of display, and location of the text so dis-
- 9 played in the chamber of the House of Representatives
- 10 shall be determined by the Architect of the Capitol in con-
- 11 sultation with the Speaker of the House of Representa-
- 12 tives. The form, size, manner of display, and location of
- 13 the text so displayed in the chamber of the Senate shall
- 14 be determined by the Architect of the Capitol in consulta-
- 15 tion with the President pro tempore of the Senate.
