CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Supporting the efforts of the United Nations to formulate a comprehensive convention on international terrorism and urging the President to continue to work in cooperation with all interested members of the United Nations to formulate such a convention.

Whereas the elimination of international terrorism requires international cooperation;

Whereas the United Nations is in the process of formulating a comprehensive convention on international terrorism based on a global consensus definition of terrorism and an agreement among member states not to assist, support, or facilitate terrorist activities or harbor terrorist organizations; and Whereas the terrorist attacks against the United States that occurred on September 11, 2001, demonstrate the need for a comprehensive convention on international terrorism: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate 2 concurring), That Congress—
- 3 (1) supports the efforts of the United Nations 4 to formulate a comprehensive convention on inter-5 national terrorism; and
- 6 (2) urges the President to continue to work in 7 cooperation with all interested members of the 8 United Nations to formulate such a convention.
