CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the District of Columbia Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**
2 **GROUND FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**
3 **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

4 On June 7, 2002, or on such other date as the Speaker
5 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
6 Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly designate,
7 the 2002 District of Columbia Special Olympics
8 Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred
9 to as the "event") may be run through the Capitol
10 Grounds as part of the journey of the Special Olympics
11 torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics summer
12 games at Gallaudet University in the District of Columbia.

14 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

15 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
16 may be necessary to carry out the event.

17 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
18 **TIONS.**

19 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
20 for physical preparations for the event.

21 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

22 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforcement
23 of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
24 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concerning
25 sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations

- 1 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
- 2 cable to the Capitol Grounds, in connection with the event.
