Mr. Rangel submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress that a commemorative postage stamp should be issued by the United States Postal Service honoring Tito Puente.

- Whereas Ernest Anthony Puente, Jr., nicknamed "Tito Puente", was born on April 20, 1923, in East Harlem, New York, and was one of the greatest Hispanic musicians in his field;
- Whereas Tito Puente was considered a musical child prodigy in Harlem at the age of 13;
- Whereas Tito Puente served in the United States Navy and received a Presidential commendation for being in 9 battles;

- Whereas Tito Puente was a 4-time Grammy Award winner and has participated in motion pictures and in television programs;
- Whereas Tito Puente created a scholarship foundation in 1980 to promote the arts and to help talented children, and since then the foundation has awarded more than 50 scholarships;
- Whereas Tito Puente has been awarded the Washington D.C. Hispanic Heritage Committee Award for the Arts and the Smithsonian Medal, in addition to other awards;
- Whereas Tito Puente has recorded more than 100 songs heard throughout the world; and
- Whereas Tito Puente died on May 31, 2000, in New York City, and will be remembered through generations as "El Rey de los Timbales": Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 - 2 concurring), That it is the sense of Congress that—
 - 3 (1) a commemorative postage stamp should be
 - 4 issued by the United States Postal Service honoring
 - 5 Tito Puente; and
 - 6 (2) the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee
 - 7 should recommend to the Postmaster General that
 - 8 such a stamp be issued.
