Condemning the heinous atrocities that occurred on March 5, 2001, at Santana High School in Santee, California

- Whereas on March 5, 2001, a gunman opened fire at Santana High School in Santee, California, killing 2 students and wounding 13 others: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 - 2 concurring), That the Congress—

1	(1) condemns, in the strongest possible terms,
2	the atrocities that occurred on March 5, 2001, at
3	Santana High School in Santee, California;
4	(2) offers its deepest condolences to the fami-
5	lies, friends, and loved ones of those killed in the
6	shooting;
7	(3) expresses hope for the rapid and complete
8	recovery of those wounded in the shooting;
9	(4) applauds the hard work and dedication ex-
10	hibited by local and State law enforcement officials
11	and by others who offered support and assistance;
12	(5) commends the rapid response by the faculty
13	and staff of Santana High School in evacuating its
14	students to safety in an efficient and effective man-
15	ner;
16	(6) encourages communities to implement a
17	wide range of violence prevention services for the
18	Nation's youth; and
19	(7) encourages the people of the United States
20	to engage in a national dialogue on preventing
21	school violence.
