JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating the square dance as the national folk dance of the United States.

- Whereas square dancing has been a popular tradition in America since early colonial days;
- Whereas square dancing has attained a revered status as part of the folklore of this Nation;
- Whereas square dancing is a joyful expression of the vibrant spirit of the people of the United States;
- Whereas square dancing promotes the practice of good manners and proper etiquette;
- Whereas square dancing is a traditional form of family recreation that fosters family unity, a basic strength of this Nation;

- Whereas square dancing embodies democratic principles by dissolving arbitrary social distinctions among its participants; and
- Whereas it is fitting that the square dance be added to the array of symbols of our national character and pride: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
 - 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 That the square dance is designated the national folk
 - 4 dance of the United States.
