Mr. JACKSON of Illinois introduced the following joint resolution; which was
referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United
States respecting the right to full employment and bal-
anced growth.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*
5 *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*
6 *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*
7 *ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several*
8 *States:*

1 “ARTICLE—

2 “SECTION 1. Every citizen has the right to work, to
3 free choice of employment, to just and favorable conditions
4 of work, and to protection against unemployment.

5 “SECTION 2. Every citizen, without any discrimination,
6 has the right to equal pay for equal work.

7 “SECTION 3. Every citizen who works has the right
8 to just and favorable remuneration ensuring for themselves
9 and their family an existence worthy of human dignity,
10 and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of
11 social protection.

12 “SECTION 4. Every citizen who works has the right
13 to form and join trade unions for the protection of their
14 interests.

15 “SECTION 5. The Congress shall have power to implement
16 this article by appropriate legislation.”.
