JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States requiring a two-thirds vote to pass legislation that would result in a deficit in the budget of the United States for any fiscal period.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-
- 3 thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "Article—
- 4 "Section 1. Any bill, resolution, or other legislative
- 5 measure the enactment of which would result in a deficit
- 6 in the budget of the United States for any fiscal period
- 7 shall require for final adoption in each House the concur-
- 8 rence of two-thirds of the Members of that House voting
- 9 and present. On any vote for which the concurrence of
- 10 two-thirds is required under this article, the year and nays
- 11 of the Members of either House shall be entered on the
- 12 Journal of that House.
- "Section 2. The Congress may waive the require-
- 14 ments of this article when a declaration of war is in effect.
- 15 The Congress may also waive this article when the United
- 16 States is engaged in military conflict which causes an im-
- 17 minent and serious threat to national security and is so
- 18 declared by a joint resolution, adopted by a majority of
- 19 the whole number of each House, which becomes law. Any
- 20 such waiver shall be effective for not longer than two
- 21 years.".
