## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to abolish the Federal income tax.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-
- 3 thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

2 "Three years after the ratification of this article of

3 amendment, the sixteenth article of amendment to the

4 Constitution of the United States is repealed, and the

5 Congress shall have no power to lay and collect taxes on

6 incomes, except in time of war declared by the Congress.".
