JOINT RESOLUTION

Providing for a 3-year moratorium on postage rate increases for nonprofit organizations and certain other mailers.

Whereas the increasing consolidation of the media is a threat to the free exchange of ideas, and makes the expression of a wide range of political, social, cultural, educational, scientific, and religious views more difficult;

Whereas small and independent periodicals are, along with the Internet, the most important guarantors of free expression of diverse ideas, views, and opinions; and

Whereas the continuing health of these vitally important small and independent periodicals is at risk each time rates of postage are increased: Now, therefore, be it

1	Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
2	of the United States of America in Congress assembled
3	That, for the 3-year period beginning on the date on which
4	this resolution is approved, rates of postage under section
5	3626 of title 39, United States Code (relating to reduced
6	rates) shall not be increased for any of the following:
7	(1) Periodical publications having a paid or re-
8	quester circulation per issue of less than 50,000.
9	(2) Any issue of a periodical publication the ad-
10	vertising portion of which is less than 20 percent or
11	such issue.
12	(3) Any publication of a nonprofit organization
13	as defined by former section 4358 of title 39, United
14	States Code
