A BILL

- To expand the Officer Next Door and Teacher Next Door initiatives of the Department of Housing and Urban Development to include fire fighters and rescue personnel, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Partners
 - 5 Neighborhood Preservation Act of 2001".
 - 6 SEC. 2. COMMUNITY PARTNERS NEXT DOOR PROGRAM.
 - 7 (a) Congressional Findings.—The Congress finds
 - 8 that—

1	(1) teachers, law enforcement officers, fire
2	fighters, and rescue personnel help form the back-
3	bones of communities and are integral components
4	in the social capital of neighborhoods in the United
5	States; and
6	(2) providing a discounted purchase price on
7	HUD-owned properties for teachers, law enforce-
8	ment officers, fire fighters, and rescue personnel rec-
9	ognizes the intrinsic value of the services provided by
10	such employees to their communities and to family
11	life and encourages and rewards those who are dedi-
12	cated to providing public service in our most needy
13	communities.
14	(b) DISCOUNT AND DOWNPAYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR
15	Teachers.—Section 204(h) of the National Housing Act
16	(12 U.S.C. 1710(h)) is amended—
17	(1) by redesignating paragraphs (7) through
18	(10) as paragraphs (8) through (11), respectively;
19	and
20	(2) by inserting after paragraph (6) the fol-
21	lowing new paragraph:
22	"(7) 50 percent discount for teachers
23	AND PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS PURCHASING PROP-
24	ERTIES THAT ARE ELIGIBLE ASSETS.—

"(A) DISCOUNT.—A property that is an el-1 2 igible asset and is sold, during fiscal years 2000 3 through 2004, to a teacher or public safety offi-4 cer for use in accordance with subparagraph 5 (B) shall be sold at a price that is equal to 50 6 percent of the appraised value of the eligible 7 property (as determined in accordance with 8 paragraph (6)(B)). In the case of a property el-9 igible for both a discount under this paragraph 10 and a discount under paragraph (6), the dis-11 count under paragraph (6) shall not apply. 12 "(B) Primary residence.—An eligible 13 property sold pursuant to a discount under this 14 paragraph shall be used, for not less than the 15 3-year period beginning upon such sale, as the 16 primary residence of a teacher or public safety 17 officer. 18 "(C) SALE METHODS.—The Secretary may 19 sell an eligible property pursuant to a discount 20 under this paragraph— "(i) to a unit of general local govern-21 ment or nonprofit organization (pursuant 22

to paragraph (4) or otherwise), for resale

or transfer to a teacher or public safety of-

ficer; or

1	"(ii) directly to a purchaser who is a
2	teacher or public safety officer.
3	"(D) Resale.—In the case of any pur-
4	chase by a unit of general local government or
5	nonprofit organization of an eligible property
6	sold at a discounted price under this paragraph,
7	the sale agreement under paragraph (8) shall—
8	"(i) require the purchasing unit of
9	general local government or nonprofit or-
10	ganization to provide the full benefit of the
11	discount to the teacher or public safety of-
12	ficer obtaining the property; and
13	"(ii) in the case of a purchase involv-
14	ing multiple eligible assets, any of which is
15	such an eligible property, designate the
16	specific eligible property or properties to be
17	subject to the requirements of subpara-
18	graph (B).
19	"(E) Mortgage downpayment assist-
20	ANCE.—If a teacher or public safety officer pur-
21	chases an eligible property pursuant to a dis-
22	counted sale price under this paragraph and fi-
23	nances such purchase through a mortgage in-
24	sured under this title, notwithstanding any pro-

1	vision of section 203 the downpayment on such
2	mortgage shall be \$100.
3	"(F) Prevention of undue profit.—
4	The Secretary shall issue regulations to prevent
5	undue profit from the resale of eligible prop-
6	erties in violation of the requirement under sub-
7	paragraph (B).
8	"(G) Definitions.—For the purposes of
9	this paragraph, the following definitions shall
10	apply:
11	"(i) The terms 'elementary school'
12	and 'secondary school' have the meanings
13	given such terms in section 14101 of the
14	Elementary and Secondary Education Act
15	of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 8801), except that, for
16	purposes of this paragraph, elementary
17	education (as used in such section) shall
18	include pre-Kindergarten education.
19	"(ii) The term 'eligible property'
20	means an eligible asset described in para-
21	graph (2)(A) of this subsection.
22	"(iii) The term 'public safety officer'
23	means an individual who is employed on a
24	full-time basis as a public safety officer, as
25	such term is defined in section 1204 of the

1	Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets
2	Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796b).
3	"(iv) The term 'teacher' means an in-
4	dividual who is employed on a full-time
5	basis, in an elementary or secondary
6	school, as a State-certified or State-li-
7	censed classroom teacher or as an adminis-
8	trator.".
9	(c) Conforming Amendments.—Section 204(h) of
10	the National Housing Act (12 U.S.C. 1710(h)) is
11	amended—
12	(1) in paragraph (4)(B)(ii), by striking "para-
13	graph (7)" and inserting "paragraph (8)";
14	(2) in paragraph (5)(B)(i), by striking "para-
15	graph (7)" and inserting "paragraph (8)"; and
16	(3) in paragraph (6)(A), by striking "paragraph
17	(8)" and inserting "paragraph (9)".
18	(d) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 90 days after the
19	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue
20	regulations to implement the amendments made by this
21	section.

1	SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING INCLUSION OF
2	OTHER FEDERAL PROPERTIES IN COMMU-
3	NITY PARTNERS NEXT DOOR PROGRAM.
4	It is the sense of the Congress that the Secretary of
5	Housing and Urban Development should consult with the
6	heads of other agencies of the Federal Government that
7	own or hold properties appropriate for use as housing to
8	determine the possibility and effectiveness of including
9	such properties in the program pursuant to section
10	204(h)(7) of the National Housing Act, and other pro-
11	grams that make housing available for law enforcement
12	officers, teachers, or fire fighters.
