## A BILL

For the relief of Sarabeth M. Davis, Robert S. Borders,  
Victor Maron, Irving Berke, and Adele E. Conrad.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. COMPENSATION FOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY**  
4                   **STUDY.**

5       (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Treasury  
6 shall pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise  
7 appropriated, \$\_\_\_\_\_ to the persons named in  
8 subsection (b) for damages sustained by such persons in  
9 connection with the air installation compatible use zone  
10 study conducted by the Secretary of the Army with respect

1 to Los Alamitos Army Airfield under part 256 of title 32,  
2 Code of Federal Regulations.

3 (b) PERSONS TO RECEIVE COMPENSATION.—The  
4 Secretary of the Treasury shall compensate the following  
5 persons under subsection (a):

6 (1) Sarabeth M. Davis of Clinton, Washington.  
7 (2) Robert S. Borders of Newport Beach, Cali-  
8 fornia.

9 (3) Victor Maron of Long Beach, California.  
10 (4) Irving Berke of Long Beach, California.  
11 (5) Adele E. Conrad of Cypress, California.

12 **SEC. 2. SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS AGAINST THE UNITED  
13 STATES.**

14 Payment under section 1 shall constitute full settle-  
15 ment of all legal and equitable claims by the persons  
16 named in section 1(b) against the United States for the  
17 damages described in section 1(a).

18 **SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON ATTORNEY AND AGENT FEES.**

19 Not more than 10 percent of the payment made  
20 under section 1 may be paid to or received by an agent  
21 or attorney as consideration for any service rendered in  
22 connection with this Act. Each violation of this section  
23 shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more  
24 than \$1,000.
