3 (b) PROHIBITION ON REDUCTION OF GRANT
4 AMOUNT UNDER IDEA.—The Secretary of Education
5 may not reduce the amount of a grant to a State under
6 part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act
7 (20 U.S.C. 1411 et seq.) by reason of the authority of
8 a State or local educational agency to transfer funds pur-
9 suant to subsection (a)(1).
