To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to increase to 100 percent the amount of the deduction for the health insurance costs of self-employed individuals.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Self-Employed Health
- 5 Affordability Act of 2001".

1	SEC. 2. DEDUCTION FOR 100 PERCENT OF HEALTH INSUR-
2	ANCE COSTS OF SELF-EMPLOYED INDIVID
3	UALS.
4	(a) In General.—Paragraph (1) of section 162(l)
5	of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended to read
6	as follows:
7	"(1) ALLOWANCE OF DEDUCTION.—In the case
8	of an individual who is an employee within the
9	meaning of section 401(c)(1), there shall be allowed
10	as a deduction under this section an amount equal
11	to 100 percent of the amount paid during the tax-
12	able year for insurance which constitutes medical
13	care for the taxpayer, his spouse, and dependents."
14	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
15	this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
16	December 31, 2000.
