- pensation received by a top executive of the carrier in calendar year 2000.
 - (b) Definitions.—In this section—

- (1) the term "air carrier" has the same meaning as such term has in section 40102 of title 49, United States Code;
- (2) the term "total compensation" includes salary, bonus payments, stock options, or any other form of contribution or payment from an air carrier to a top executive that results in a financial benefit to such executive; and
- (3) the term "top executive" means the president, chief executive officer, chief financial officer, chief operating officer, the chief information officer, and the 6 highest paid executives of an air carrier, not including the preceding named executives.
