Mr. CRENSHAW introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

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## A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to require background checks for individuals enrolled in flight schools, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Safe Skies Act of  
5       2001”.

6       **SEC. 2. BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR FLIGHT STUDENTS.**

7       Section 44707 of title 49, United States Code, is  
8       amended—

9               (1) by inserting “(a) IN GENERAL.—” before  
10       “The Administrator”; and

1 (2) by adding at the end the following:

2 “(b) BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR FLIGHT STU-  
3 DENTS.—

4 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall  
5 take such action as may be necessary to ensure that  
6 each individual who is enrolled or to be enrolled in  
7 a civilian school for instruction in flying a single-en-  
8 gine or multi-engine aircraft or helicopter, or who  
9 has commenced flight training (other than ground  
10 training) from an authorized flight instructor of  
11 such an aircraft or helicopter, is the subject of a  
12 background review conducted by the Administrator  
13 and paid for by such individual.

14 “(2) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of  
15 Congress that the Administrator, the Director of the  
16 Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Director of  
17 the Central Intelligence Agency should ensure that  
18 background reviews carried out under this section are  
19 completed in not more than 28 days after—

20 “(A) the effective date of this subsection;

21 or

22 “(B) in the case of an individual to be en-  
23 rolled for instruction described in paragraph (1)  
24 after such effective date, the date of application  
25 for such enrollment.

1           “(3) ANNUAL REPORT.—The Administrator of  
2           the Federal Aviation Administration shall prepare  
3           and transmit to the Committee on Transportation  
4           and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives  
5           and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and  
6           Transportation of the Senate an annual report de-  
7           tailing the number of background reviews performed  
8           during the preceding year, number of individuals  
9           failing such reviews, and an outline of the reasons  
10          for such failures.

11          “(4) BACKGROUND REVIEW DEFINED.—In this  
12          section, the term ‘background review’, commonly  
13          known as an indices check, means a review of infor-  
14          mation provided by the Director of Central Intel-  
15          ligence and the Director of the Federal Bureau of  
16          Investigation regarding personal background, includ-  
17          ing information relating to any history of criminal  
18          activity or to any evidence of espionage or ter-  
19          rorism.”.

20   **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

21          The amendments made by section 2 shall take effect  
22          on the 90th day following the date of enactment of this  
23          Act.

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
